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

- Availability of EQA programmes from regional providers
- Cost of participation in International programmes
- Poor appreciation of value of EQA.



EQUAFRICA'S 3 STEP STRATERGY



Step 1

Ensure coverage of EQA for AMR under One Health

- Strengthen existing regional capacity at NICD-NHLS.
- Expand capacity with establishment of new providers to produce and distribute high quality EQA panels covering GLASS and FAO priority pathogens.
- Formulate and implement business plans supporting the long-term viability of the programmes.

Step 2

Increase EQA programme establishment and uptake

- Promote national policy and regulation for quality-assured testing and AMR surveillance under a One Health approach.
- Build capacity to establish and manage national EQA programmes Including training on:
 - ISO17043 requirements for PT providers
 - Panel preparation and shipment
 - Performance analysis, reporting and support to address poor performance.

Step 3


Improve performance of participants

- Implement EQA within the larger perspective of sustainable and country-owned quality assurance programmes through the strengthening/establishment of QMS.
- Train and qualify workforce on QMS and ISO standards.
- Support performance of root cause analysis and implementation of CAPA to address poor performance.



I. ENSURE COVERAGE OF EQA FOR AMR UNDER ONE HEALTH






- 133 participating Laboratories across 14 priority countries:

EQA TRAINING & QUALIFICATION FRAMEWORK




- Strengthen capacity of EQA providers and participants across key elements through targeted training and competence assessment within a qualification curriculum program:
 - Establishment, operation and management of EQA programs including:
 - ✓ ISO/IEC 17043:2010 requirements for EQA providers
 - ✓ panel manufacturing
 - ✓ shipping panels with adherence to International Air Transport Association certification
 - ✓ results evaluation and reporting
 - ✓ provision of support to participants, and
 - ✓ use the programme informatics system



EQA Training and Qualification Framework and Qualification Exam







- Finalize and launch framework
- Administer first set of qualification exams:
 - ✓ 115 participants
 - √ 3 EQA Providers
- Separate exams for providers and participants
 - ✓ Generic and discipline specific modules

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



- <u>4</u> Labs already received recommendation for accreditation (1 HH, 3 non-HH)
- <u>7</u> Labs in 5 countries to be assessed before close of year


15 labs currently under assessment in 6 countries

CHALLENGES AT COUNTRY LEVEL




Lack of national systems for implementation of Laboratory Quality Management System (LQMS) at all levels of the laboratory network:

- No mandate or support for LQMS implementation and EQA participation
- □ No Quality Infrastructure to support/guide
 QMS implementation
- No established standards for laboratory quality



Quality Management Systems (LQMS): Building National Quality Infrastructure






- ☐ Guide and facilitate country-level efforts of strengthening national laboratory systems and networks.
- ☐ Use by policy makers and health service regulators in the establishment and amendment of national policies aimed at facilitating the implementation of laboratory quality management systems.
- □ Serve as a practical guide during the development or updating of the national laboratory quality policies and strategic plans.

- ✓ Increase coverage in priority countries
- ✓ Expand coverage to non FF countries
