Transportation to Leiden Central Railway Station

Arrival at Schiphol Airport Amsterdam

From Schiphol Airport Leiden can be easily accessed public transport. There is a good train connection between Schiphol Airport and Leiden Central Station. Every 15 minutes an intercity service leave from Schiphol Airport to Leiden Central Station (next call) [Direction Den Haag Centraal Station or Dordrecht]. It takes you in 15 minutes to Leiden Central Station.

Alternatively you can take a local train (Sprinter) to Den Haag Centraal Station. The fourth call after Schiphol Airport in Leiden Central Station. This train runs 2 times per hour and takes in 25 minutes to Leiden Central Station.

Travel by international trains

From Germany, Belgium, France and United Kingdom there are highspeed train (Eurostar / Deutsche Bahn) connections to The Netherlands.

From Germany change train in Utrecht Central Station for a connecting train to Leiden. From Belgium, France and United Kingdom change train in Rotterdam Central Station for a connecting train to Leiden.

Leiden “the key city”

Leiden has a long history of culture and learning. It has been home to the famous painter Rembrandt, Dutch royalty and many great scientists (including 16 Nobel prize winners). That is why it's known as the "City of Science".

Leiden served as a several-year stop-off between England and the New World for America's Pilgrim fathers in the early 17th century.

It offers many pretty courtyard gardens, hundreds of monuments, the oldest university in the Netherlands, 13 museums, a bustling city centre and more than 28 kilometres worth of canals and waterways in the city's historic centre.

The coat of arms of Leiden is two red keys, crossed in an X-shape on a white background. These keys are the Keys of Heaven held by St. Peter, for whom a large church in the city centre is named. Because of this coat of arms, Leiden is referred to as the "Sleutelstad" ("the key city").

On the evening of Thursday, October 16th the Congress Dinner will be held in the museumcafé of the historic Museum Boerhaave in the centre of Leiden.

Rijksmuseum Boerhaave is a Dutch museum dedicated to the history of science and medicine. Located in Leiden, it showcases a vast collection of scientific instruments, medical artifacts, and historic objects. The museum emphasizes the role of science in shaping modern society and highlights key figures and discoveries in fields like medicine, physics, and chemistry. Through exhibitions and interactive displays, it aims to engage visitors with the rich history of scientific progress and its impact on everyday life.

You will have the opportunity to visit the museum before dinner and during dinner the Anatomical Theatre will be open.

Each participant will receive a free entrance ticket to be used within 2 days after the congress dinner.

The museum is a 15 minutes' walk from the venue.
